Landscape Service Update

Consultation Report



We will be updating you quarterly on the work required to deliver the landscape service throughout the Parish. There is a great deal of preparation required for the Parish Council to be ready for April 2020 when we take on the landscaping from Milton Keynes Council and take in-house the delivery of the current landscaping contract, which up till now has been carried out by an outside contractor.

As of the 1st November 2019 we will be delivering the landscape service at Oldbrook Green, Fishermead and Woolstone Sports Grounds, our allotment sites and the pond at Woolstone.

In readiness for the task ahead we have recruited a Landscape Supervisor and one Operative who will be staring work this month.

The winter months, with their short days, give restricted opportunity for some work, however, during this time we will be mapping out the landscaping in the Parish, familiarising ourselves with the variety of planting, drawing up maintenance schedules, short, medium and long term and receiving training on Health & Safety issues, and the machinery necessary for the delivery of the service.

The Depot on Oldbrook Green has been identified as the base for the delivery of the service. The current building does not provide adequate security, parking, storage or amenities required. The site will need to provide facilities for the staff using the depot (toilet, shower, mess room), storage for smaller tools and equipment, an area to undertake maintenance of equipment, a diesel storage tank with power, area to store materials and chemicals, yard area to park vehicles, wash down area with separation tank to clean down machinery, all in a safe and secure site.

A planning application to expand the depot to provide an additional secure equipment store and yard space has been submitted to Milton Keynes Council.

Willen Conservation Area Review

Milton Keynes Council is currently in the process of reviewing all 27 of its designated conservation areas, including the one in Willen.

.

Conservation areas are designated to promote better design for proposed new buildings, place limits on advertising, discourage alterations that would harm local character, limit works that can be carried out without planning permission (permitted development) and provide controls over loss or harm to trees and the demolition of unlisted buildings.

For the management of conservation areas to be effective the council should have up to date information about a designated location and what makes it special. This helps to manage changes to those locations whilst avoiding or minimising harm. Conservation area reviews are the means by which the success of change management through planning controls are assessed and any necessary adjustments to boundaries or changes of emphasis to management policies are made. Milton Keynes Council has commenced the process of writing a draft review document for Willen which will contain a history of the buildings and places included in the conservation area, a character statement and a management plan. A consultation period will commence on the 21st of October for a 6 week period so that local residents have an opportunity to contribute to a better understanding of the conservation area. The details of how to contribute will be provided at the time of the consultation. The existing conservation area was first designated in 1977. Advice Worker





Campbell Park Parish Council has employed an Advice Worker for the Parish to help advise residents. I have therefore taken up this role. **My name is Priscilla Hogan.**

Fundamental Issues

There is a common syndrome which affect many people to become homeless due to not having money mainly because they don't have a job. Then families concerned lives can change drastically. For example, Benefit, Council Tax, Arrears Housing, Utility Bills, Money Management, Family or Domestic difficulties and many more. All these issues can lead to homelessness.

These matters changes ways of how one would have had been living prior to the situation they find themselves in, especially when vital services are hidden and residents are NOT being aware of where to go or to ask next! Many residents are not aware of where to find services and or how to contact those relevant services to acquire assistants. I would then advise residents and or signposting to appropriate services they so need.

WE ARE HERE TO HELP

Residents of the Parish should not face struggles alone when it not a fault of their own, but they can seek advice in the Parish. Residents could become more vulnerable in terms of financial strains/burdens.

Information obtained from local citizens is not going to be mishandled or divulged to anyone who has no need to see/know without consent.





location and hours of work.



Budget / Precept

Campbell Park Parish Council

We would like to thank all our residents who responded to the consultation, 704 households in all, an 11.89% return rate, our highest yet.

The questionnaire was divided into 3 sections, Campbell Park Parish Council Service Provision, Landscaping and Precept.

In the first section you were asked to prioritise 3 out of 12 services, namely:

Community Centre

improvements / ongoing improvement of Parish recreation & sports grounds / Parish Family picnics/fun days / Grants to local community groups & community facilities / Civil Contingency response and resources / Parish Community events / local traffic schemes/ improvements / Play area improvements (in partnership with MKC) / Dog waste bins / litter bins/ Celebration/ Commemorative community events / Community legal representation on planning issues.

Your Priorities

Your top priority was Local Traffic Schemes/Improvements [27.54%], with Litter Bins topping your second and third priorities [21.66%] and [13.88%) respectively.

Consultation

Following our consultation with you in July 2018, we asked for your views on the landscape service provided by Milton



Keynes Council (MKC) and if you were in favour of the Parish Council taking over the service from MKC and if you were prepared to pay an additional Precept of £30 (Band D) to cover the associated costs in delivering the landscaping service.

The majority of those who responded to the consultation were in favour of the Parish Council taking on the service and were prepared to pay the increase in the precept.

Maintenance Strategy

As you will appreciate there is a great deal of work to be done before we take over the contract from MKC in April 2020, not least the recruitment of staff, purchasing equipment and developing the landscape depot at Oldbrook in readiness for April 2020 (see page 3 for an update on the delivery of the landscape service). With this in mind in Section 2 we asked for your views on the current landscaping in your area in order to develop an effective Parish wide maintenance strategy, and invited you to prioritise two areas of landscaping that you believed would make a positive impact on your area. Your first priority was Hedge cutting (62.48%) followed by Grass cutting as

your second priority (39.84%). These priorities were consistent on a ward by ward basis.

In Section 3, we asked for your views on the level of the precept. In our introductory letter to the consultation, we advised you that the Parish Council had made an "in principle" decision to increase the precept by 5% equating to an additional cost of £8.79 per annum on a Band D property. We were pleased that you acknowledged that providing services costs money and this was reflected in your response, with 61.60% of you in favour of increasing the precept up to 5% compared to 38.40% who were against a rise in the precept.

Your response to the consultation will be considered by our Committees and Council over the next 3 months and will assist us in setting our targets and budgets for 2020/2021.

The full report with a breakdown by wards will be available on our website at the end of October and once again we would like to thank you for taking the time to respond to the consultation.

The Parish Council is here to serve the needs of our residents and where possible to deliver the services you would like. We not only value your input but need it to serve you in the best way possible.



MILTON KEYNES Reader Service

Milton Keynes Reader Service is a local Charity offering free services to any adult living in the Milton Keynes area who finds reading and writing difficult due to physical or visual disability. Currently the Charity provides one to one support to over 100 Service Users across Milton Keynes.

These services include:

A face to face reading and writing service for people in their own homes. This can include help with correspondence and form filling, or reading just for pleasure. A facilitation service which includes a "shop and see" service where a volunteer will take a service user either grocery or general shopping.

Help with one-off trips to the theatre, cinema, seminars, museums, art galleries or other educational or cultural activities.

Our trained volunteers are DBS checked and carefully matched with their service user to enable them to develop a successful and long-lasting relationship.

As a totally blind resident living

within the Campbell park parish boundary I use this service on a regular basis. It gives me choice and control that I otherwise might not experience.

The Peartree Memory Clubs give people the chance to enjoy social interaction in a friendly, supportive environment. Carers can have a break whilst the person experiencing memory-related problems enjoys chatting to others and taking part in group activities. The Monday session runs 2.00 - 4.00pm and includes light refreshments, and the Friday session runs 1.30 - 4.30pm and includes an afternoon tea.
