At the end of September Campbell Park Parish Council finished it's third 12 week run on our local radio station, with our programme Park Life.

This third run was the most successful series, as we are absorbing lessons learnt, and provided a live broadcast for every show.

Our initial intention was to let residents and workers within our Parish be more aware of who we are, and what we strive to achieve for the community.

The First Series

On the shows in the first series we expanded details of all the various personnel and councillors and the committees they served, extending invitations to learn about the diverse areas of the new city we cover. This included featuring the five residential areas we are responsible for, also not ignoring our commercial areas.

The Second Series

The second series was to build on this, expanding with details of projects in the pipeline, and our aims at Campbell Park Parish Council. We encouraged feedback and urged close engagement with our Parish magazine, supplementing the information provided with that quarterly publication by updating events and details of all the committee meetings.

Success

The recent series was very successful for a number of reasons. We invited partners that this council helps to talk about the projects they run, and invited professionals that deal with issues that affect the whole of Milton Keynes, not just our Parish. To this end we have broadcast discussions on Mental Health. Armed Forces Covenant. Loneliness, New Landscaping arrangements, together with reminding people of fantastic buildings for children to learn such as Hazard Alley.

Chairman's Half Year Report

Campbell Park Parish Council



With so much going on within the Parish Council, Members have hardly had time to draw breath.

In House Landscaping

Our new in house Landscape Team, headed up by our new team manager, Daniel Mott, has as of November 1st started to work on the Parish owned land that we previously contracted out. Those residents in Oldbrook, a grant to St Marks Meals to Fishermead, Springfield, Willen and Woolstone will see them working on parts of their grid squares. We have taken the decision to purchase the equipment needed for the contract, the remainder will be delivered during March 2020.

We soon realised that we needed a home for all of the equipment and for the team. Oldbrook Green Landscape Depot is the ideal location and of course belongs to the Parish under a long lease. The Buildings and Property Committee decided on the changes that would be required and we completed all necessary checks for suitability of the ground etc for a large extension to the existing depot. We were granted planning permission by MKC and by the time you are reading this our contractor should be working

towards the team being able to use the building some time in April.

Advice Service

The Parish Council has taken the decision to extend our Advice Service to 2 days per week by employing our own advice officer; Pricilla Hogan has many years of experience and is available by appointment in the Parish Office on a Wednesday and Thursday. The service is able to give advise on a large number of subjects and could where necessary, signpost individuals to other agencies who are better placed to deal with their issues or concerns.

St Marks Meals

The Parish Council provided support their project to supply local schools and children centres with meal boxes for families in need.

Parish Council Events

Once again, the Parish Council held events throughout the year for families, these included the Parish Picnics held in each residential ward, the Four Bridges Festival in conjunction with Woughton Community Council and additional arts and crafts sessions during the summer holidays where children were also provided with lunch. We further supported our children by providing funding to enable every Year 5 and 6 attending schools within our Parish, to attend Hazard Alley, Kiln Farm, where they are taught about everyday hazards that they could easily come across and how to deal with the problems faced.

Councillors were very keen to ensure that this continues and have adjusted our 5-year budget forecast to include earmarked funding for every Year 5 student to visit Hazard Alley.

Armed Forces Covenant

I am pleased to report that this Parish Council was one of the first to sign up to the Armed Forces Covenant, a well-deserved initiative which supports veterans and their families.

Grants Available

We would like to see more community groups who work within the Parish to come forward and apply for a grant of up to £1000 or £1500 if a new start up group. For further information please contact the Parish office.

Finally, may I take this opportunity on behalf of the Members and Officers of Campbell Park Parish Council to wish each and everyone of you a happy, and prosperous new year.

Cyclists you need to be seen

We are lucky in Campbell Park Parish that we are surrounded by well serviced redways. There are however, lots of cyclist who continue to use the roads and pavements around the estates. At this time of year with daylight between 9am and 4pm cyclists run the risk of either having a collision with a vehicle or pedestrians.

Cyclists where ever they ride are reminded that during the hours of darkness you need front and rear lights to comply with the law, and to be seen by other users.

WHY BEING SEEN MAITTERS

Many accidents happen to cyclists because others cannot see them until it is too late to stop. This problem is worse at night and in poor weather conditions. Make sure you wear the right clothing so you can be seen. Fluorescent and reflective clothing.

By wearing the right clothing, you increase your chances of being seen. Help others to see you by wearing bright and fluorescent materials in daytime and reflective materials at night.


Fluorescent clothing enables the cyclist to be seen in daytime or in poor weather much more easily than if you are wearing dark clothing. A number of different fluorescent clothing items and accessories are available to help you to be seen by drivers.

In order to be seen at night you will require reflective clothing. This reflects light straight back at drivers so that they can see you. Reflective material is available as self adhesive strips, stickers etc. which can easily be attached to clothes and other items such as school bags.



LOOK LIGHT LOCK

WINTER BURGLARY



Think of the 3 x Ls

LOOK LIGHT LOCK

Look

Don't let the burglar window-shop your valuables.

Ensure valuables such as TVs, Laptops, mobile phones and handbags are out of sight.

Burglars could break into your home if they see something they want.

Burglars could use objects to grab what they want through the letterbox including house and vehicle keys left on hall-tables or window ledges.



Lights

Don't let the burglar go undetected.

Use energy saving light bulbs and timers to make your house appear occupied.

Homes that look unoccupied, particularly after dark are a magnet for burglars.

Use a motion sensor doorstep light that warns you and your neighbours when someone is at your home during the hours of darkness.

Lock

Don't let the burglar walk right in.

Always double lock doors and lock windows when you are at home. Open doors and windows are an invitation to a burglar.

Thieves don't like a challenge, so simple window locks can put them off. Thieves can also open locked doors from outside using various objects through the letterbox and through cat-flaps, by hooking out keys from locks. Remove keys and put them out of sight.

Consider getting a letterbox

guard. Visit a local retailer and purchase a 24-hour segment timer for approx £5. The timer can be used with a lamp, radio or TV to give the impression that someone is at home.

Register your valuables on **www.immobilise.com**.

It's free and takes just a few minutes, and if your valuables are stolen, will allow you to tell the police, your insurer and the second-hand trade to assist in recovering your property and catch the thief.

Keep valuables out of sight.

Landscape Service Update

Campbell Park Parish Council

Campbell Park Parish is a very diverse place within easy reach of the city centre. Across the Parish we have a wide variety of landscaped areas. These areas are currently in a declining condition with a number of overgrown areas and plants which are past their best.

As of April 2020 the Parish Council will be taking on a devolved landscape service. This service will cover the same areas in which Milton Keynes Council (though Serco their contractor) deliver the service.

As a Parish Council we understand there is a need to improve the current standards and deliver a higher quality landscape to our residents.

In order to provide this, we are well underway in ensuring we will have what we need to provide and develop the service for the residents of the Parish.

This includes recruiting and building a team who recognise the issues and are able to work towards the standards we wish to achieve. To enable us to attain these standards, we need to provide the right equipment, so they can do the tasks asked of them and further provide the team with a base of operations, which will enable them to work efficiently from one location. We need to ensure that we manage the service to produce the best outcomes and work with residents to try and address



as many concerns as we are able to, in line with the work we are taking on from Milton Keynes Council.

Together we look to work hard for the community and over the next few years start to make a difference in the landscape of the Parish.

November we have taken
on direct responsibility for
maintenance of Parish managed
grounds including Oldbrook
Green, Fishermead Sports
ground and Woolstone Green
so you will see some of our
operatives out and about across
the Parish.

Caring within the community

MAKE A CHANGE, BECOME A COUNCILLOR

Campbell Park Parish Council is calling on residents passionate about their community to stand in the local elections in May 2020.

What do councillor do?

Councillors are the champions of their community and give residents a voice on the decisions the council makes. Becoming a councillor will allow you to make a real difference in your community by engaging with residents, local groups and businesses to find out their needs; making decisions on which services and projects the council should take forward; and getting involved locally to ensure the services are meeting your community's needs.

How long does it take?

The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) Local Councillor Census Survey found that councillors put aside, on average, three hours a week for council work. This often includes attending meetings, engaging with residents and speaking on behalf of the council to other bodies.

Can I stand?

There are only a few rules to stand for election. You must be:

- A British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth, or the European Union
- 18 years of age or older
- Live in an area that is served by a local council

School Parking

Campbell Park Parish Council

The Parish Council,

and residents have all
been instrumental in the
installation of parking
restrictions outside
Orchard Academy in
Springfield. The extension
of school zig zag lines,
double yellow lines and
single yellow lines with
restrictions have now
been in place for around
six months.

These restrictions have had a limited effect on the inconsiderate parking at school start and finish times. However, despite the attendance of Parish Councillors and Officers along



with MKC enforcement Officers and Thames Valley Police
Officers advising people of their responsibilities with regard to these restrictions, there is still a section of vehicle owners who continue to flout these measures.

We will continue our efforts to make the streets around the school safe for children and their parents. To this end we have asked MKC Parking Enforcement Officers to make regular patrols and issue fixed penalty notices where applicable.

CHAPMAN'S EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION



(Chapman's Charity-Founded 1786)

The Trustees had their Annual AGM at Ravenstone Community Centre on the 5th October 2019, (the venue alternates with Woolstone every other year).

Christa Pumfrey, the Vicar of Ravenstone, was re-elected as chairperson for the coming year, with the Membership of the Committee approved and the Minutes of the meeting held on the 6th October 2018 agreed. All other Trustee's remain the same. There will be a vacancy next year to coopt a trustee. The Committee

approved some minor changes to the Trust document, namely Milton Keynes Council to replace Bucks County Council. Copies of updated maps showing the boundary of Milton Keynes to be circulated to all Trustees.

The Committee approved the Clause 16 expenditure of £250 for Sunday schools in Ravenstone and Stoke Goldington and £500 for Woolstone. The Committee received a report from Ravenstone Village Hall Management Committee, which the Charity owns and supports for repairs and updating the fabric of the hall.

The Management Committee have been invited to investigate to the possibility of updating the heating in the hall. Funding maybe available through the Lottery Fund.

The Charity awarded £11,000 in grants shared amongst the 28 grant applications from applicants living in Ravenstone, Stoke Goldington, Weston Underwood, Gayhurst, Monkston, Broughton, Woolstone, Fishermead, Willen and Campbell Park. The funding for the grants comes from investments made by the Charity.

The Committee approved the accounts, reappointed the auditors and acknowledged the Charity Commission returns for 2018.

The Committee noted the letters of thanks received for grants for 2018

Now remember, if the canal freezes over do not go on the ice. Keep safe. Also remember to wear your green tick code badges on the right sleeve of your coat, so it will light up when oncoming cars come near you when you stand by the cars to cross the road.


